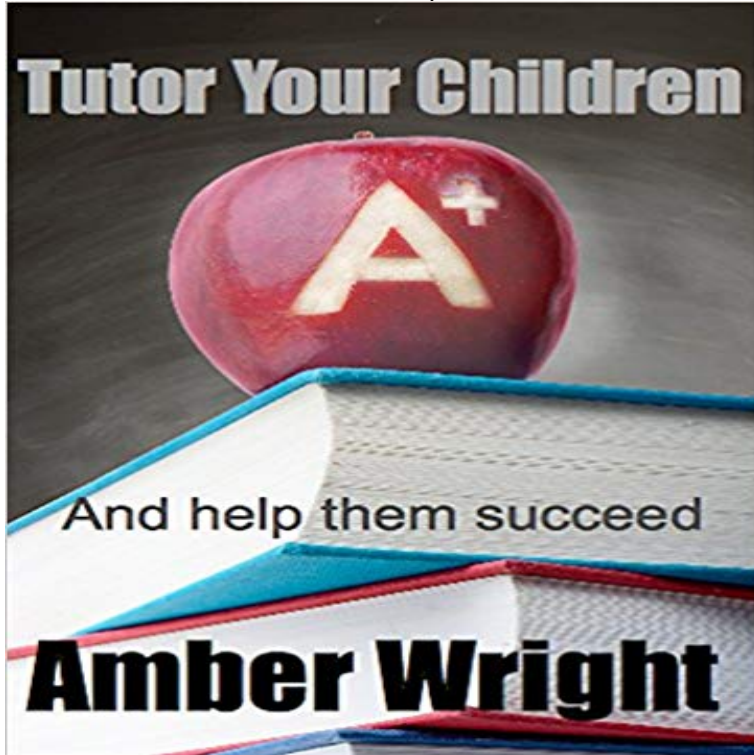


Tutor Your Children (Parent Involved Education Book 1)
