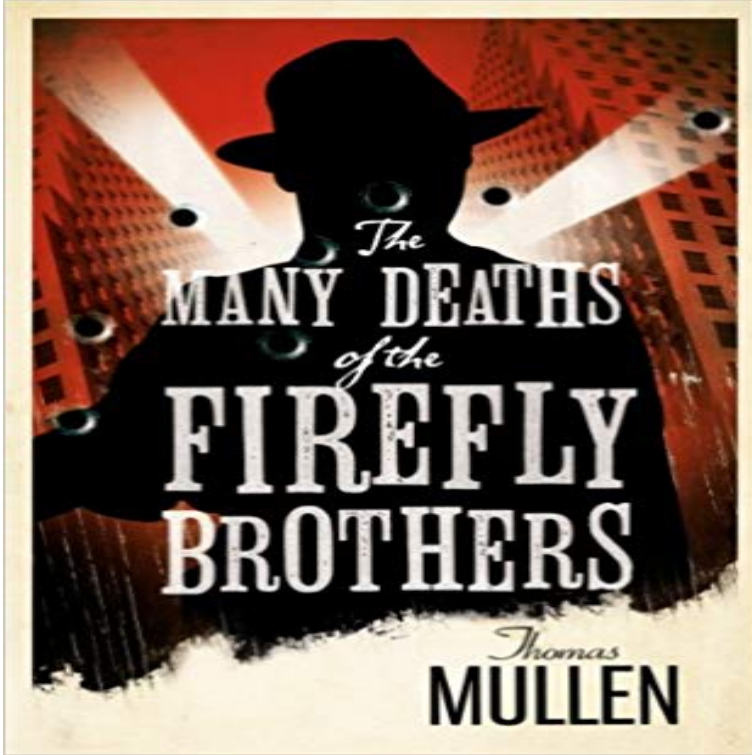


The Many Deaths of the Firefly Brothers
